Eucalyptus Nitens (Shining Gum)

Eucalyptus Nitens are classed as fast growing trees, with a typical height of between 30-50 metres. The natural habitat is the tablelands of Victoria and NSW, and has become a valuable species within the plantation timber industry.

It is a hardy grower, and prefers cooler environments with good rainfall. They tolerate extreme cold conditions and are frost resistant.

Their bark is attractive, initially green and develops into peeling loose strips, the outer bark is a rough reddish brown and the inner bark is a smooth creamy white to yellow green, often described as shiny. Small white flowers are produced in summer.

It is advised to part 3-5 meters apart, and 2.5 meters in between rows.

Like all trees, Eucalyptus Nitens are subject to genetic and environmental variation. It is not possible to fully predict its characteristics.

Shining Gums are generally available from July to October. Please refer to our current price list for costs, and be mindful that notification 2 days prior to collection or delivery is essential.
